

The wedding feast of Cana presented to us in the gospel of John is rich in meaning, as it reveals both the relationship of Mary and Jesus, as well as Jesus' response to his mother. In the time and culture of Jesus, a wedding was a significant event that could last for several days. Running out of wine would be a major embarrassment to those hosting the wedding. Mary recognizes the problem and brings it to Jesus' attention in a pithy declaration: "They have no wine" Jesus responds with "woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come" Mary does not tell Jesus what to do or how to do it. She simply states the need, fully trusting in his response to her words. Jesus in his generosity and love for his mother and the Groom and the Bride provides quality and abundant wine for the wedding celebration to avoid embarrassment and shame. John tells us that this is the first sign Jesus performed and he did this to reveal his glory to his disciples. Jesus' first miracle or sign taking place in the context of a wedding feast speaks to us about the importance of Marriage and its role in God's plan. It also reveals to us that when God is present in our vocations and other areas of our lives, we experience his abundant blessings but if we leave him out of our lives, we are bound to fail. Sadly, there are people who insist that it is their marriage, their life, their happiness and their right to seek it however and wherever it may be found. Rather than turning to the Lord for help, they rely on themselves, and inevitably, they run out of wine. Let us be reminded that "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it" (Psalm 127).

For the next several weeks we will be exploring and reflecting on the Sacrament of Baptism.
