Last Sunday's Gospel reading was about how the devil tempted Jesus Christ three times in the desert. But that holy Gospel ends with the notion that the devil wasn't going to be given up trying to "*seduce*"/tempt Jesus. He says that he was going to wait until another time. If the devil has the audacity to tempt the Son of God and not want to give up, why would one ever think that he is not trying to "*seduce*"/tempt us. I believe that the power of evil, the work of Satan, is very real. The devil is much smarter than people. He "*seduces*" them to believe that he doesn't exist. And how many people believe there isn't a devil. I believe that is one of the reasons that evil seems to be running rampant. Ideologies have been infiltrated by Satan. 




