JULY 21, 2024 SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Faithful Parishioners,

I am Fr. Sylvester Bioh from Ghana in West Africa. We are five in the family, four boy

and a girl and I am the oldest. Both my Parents and my other Siblings are in Ghana. I was born in Dwoamin, a village in the Ashanti Region of Ghana and I had the elementary and junior high school there. I became an Altar server at the age of ten and through my interactions with the priests who were in the parish, I developed interest in the Priesthood. The initial attraction was the Priest's vestments. Anytime I saw my Pastor wearing his vestment, I was so happy. One day while in the sanctuary, my Pastor saw me looking at him, so he asked, Sylvester, what is the matter with you? I replied, Father I want to wear your vestment in the future. My Pastor was so happy to hear that, and he encouraged me to pray over it and study hard. The interest of becoming a Catholic Priest was still in my mind but it became very strong after the completion of senior high school .I informed my parents about my intention of becoming a Priest. They were happy of my decision, so my Father and I went to see the Vocations Director in the diocese of Obuasi and I was accepted to be a Seminarian. I had the Philosophical and Theological Studies at St. Paul's Major Seminary in Accra and St. Peter's Regional Seminary in Cape Coast, respectively. During the process of discernment in the seminary, I realized that the Priesthood is not just wearing the vestments, but it includes a lot of things namely, prayer, commitment, discipline, Handwork, sacrifice etc. After the seminary formation, I was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on August 4, 2007. I was appointed as the parochial vicar at St. Thomas Cathedral in Obuasi. After four years at the Cathedral, I was appointed as a Pastor at St. Aloysius Parish at Fereso and was transferred to another Parish as a pastor after four years. After two years at St. John the Baptist Parish in New Edubiase, my Bishop sent me to the diocese of Rochester to continue the priestly ministry. I came to the diocese of Rochester in 2017. My first assignment was at the Parish of the Holy Family in Gates as a parochial vicar, and I also served as a chaplain at the Rochester Regional Health in Parkridge. I was moved to St. Luke the Evangelist Parish in Geneseo after three and half years in Gates and after three years in Geneseo, Bishop Matano asked me to come to St. Michael Parish in Newark, St. Joseph the Worker Parish in Clyde, and Blessed Trinity in Wolcott. It is so good to be here

Thank you for accepting me and may God richly bless you. Rev Fr. Svlvester Bioh Parochial Vicar

and with God's grace and your help I hope to do my best.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture


Burnout. Recent studies suggest that roughly two-thirds of doctors and nurses have signs of it. You probably know what burnout is: long-term stress leading to emotional exhaustion and a lack of a sense of personal accomplishment. Burnout can threaten anyone who tries to seriously serve and love others. How does our faith inform this challenging experience and how do we find refreshment?

The apostles face something like burnout this week in Mark 6. They are run down from their missionary work, and Jesus vicome away by yourselves to a lonely place, and rest a while." For them, and for us, it takes humility to intentionally rest. It means the world can go on without us. It stings our pride to admit God is necessary and we are not. Choosing to leave our good work to be with him — whatever the cost — is an act of humble faith. And that trust in God begins to revive us.

But there's more to it. Hilariously, Mark tells us that throngs of needy people find out where the apostles are going and arrive ahead of them. Imagine the exasperation of the burnt-out apostles. "Can we please get a minute to ourselves? This is not healthy!" And Jesus seems to encourage the boundary violation by telling his frayed followers to feed the crowd. Look: once we move into humble rest, he calls us to more work, because we are made for love, not for rest. But Jesus does the vast bulk of the labor. He himself is the one who multiplies the small offering until everyone is satisfied.

What finally gives our heart rest isn't more vacation time. It's experiencing the super abundant generosity of God for us and those whom we serve.

Family demands can make us feel like Jesus and the twelve apostles. We wish for times of relaxation and renewal, but there are errands to do, household chores to keep up with, volun-

teer commitments to keep. These are all good things, but we can be left feeling drained and tired as we try to keep up. Perhaps we might take the opportunity this week to give ourselves permission to find the rest and relaxation that Jesus seeks for his disciples in today's Gospel. One of the gifts we can give to one another in our family life is assistance in finding the time and space to renew ourselves

When you gather together as a family this week, bring your family calendar. Together review your family calendar and spend some time reflecting on your family activities. In particular, ask if your family has an appropriate amount of time for rest and relaxation. If not, discuss ways in which this time for renewal might be included in the week ahead. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 6:30-34. Notice how Jesus tried to find time and space for his disciples to rest and relax after they returned from their mission. Conclude in prayer together, asking God to help us find time to renew ourselves so that we might be better disciples of Jesus. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.
