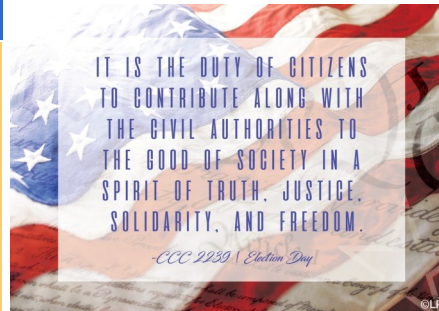

This Tuesday, November 5th is Election Day and we are called to cast our vote. When we do not vote we are saying something, and I do not believe it is helpful to our society. Our federal

government is important. The issues on the ballot are important and we need to get out there and vote. Some of the issues are incredibly complex and others are simple enough. I encourage you to read up on the ballot issues and the candidates. Be aware of what we are voting for and who we are voting for. I will not tell you "how to vote" but I do think it is my moral responsibility to remind you of your privilege and responsibility to vote. Please mail in your ballot or show up at one of the many sites for voting. Together our votes make a difference, and our democracy is better served when we exercise our right to vote.

The Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) has begun, and we are off to a good start. **St. Michael - Newark's** goal is **\$41,000**. Presently, we have **\$11,845** that is 28.89% pledged toward our goal. **St. Joseph the Worker** Parish's goal is **\$34,000**. Presently, we have **\$10,500** that is 30.88% pledged toward our goal. **Catholic Community of Blessed Trinity's** goal is **\$16,000**. Presently, we have **\$3,285** that is 20.53% pledged toward our goal. Please try to add another \$5-\$10 more to your pledge this year. Every dollar helps us get closer to our goal! Together I know we can do it! Thanks for contributing to this important fund that supports all our ministry in the parishes.

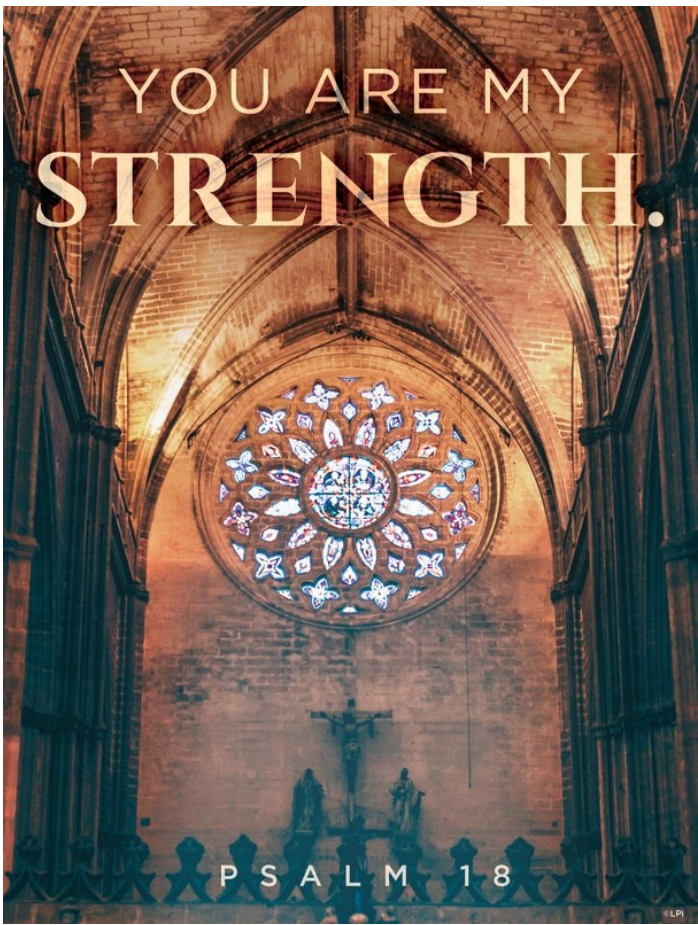
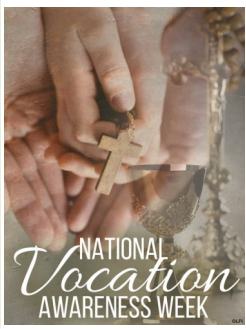

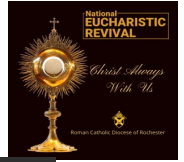

Proposal 1 (One) a/k/a the Equal Rights Amendment or ERA

On November 5th, Election Day, New York State voters will be asked to vote on this amendment. According to Timothy Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop of New York and other bishops of NY State, including Bishop of Rochester Salvatore Matano, and the Coalition to Protect Kids, the title suggests a noble cause but is broadly written so, the above are opposed to it. This bill will change NY State's constitution which may lead to legalized abortion without restriction. The inclusion of "age" as a protected class could lead to parents' rights being stripped away and permit children to make decisions on their own regarding treatments and surgeries. We should prayerfully consider all this and vote with our conscience.
